Yndling is the Norwegian dream-pop project of Silje Espevik, blending shoegaze, trip-hop, and alt-pop into an atmospheric, forward-looking sound. Her new album *Time Time Time (I'm in the Palm of Your Hand)* and its lead single “It’s Almost Like You’re Here” have earned strong international attention and major Spotify support. Following sold-out UK headline shows and appearances at SXSW, ESNS, and SPOT, Yndling brings her immersive live show on a European tour in spring 2026, including Berlin, Bern, Paris, and Barcelona.

Yndling is the dream-pop project of Norwegian artist and producer Silje Espevik, whose blend of shimmering shoegaze, trip-hop influences, and melancholic alt-pop has quickly marked her as one of Europe’s most exciting new voices. With her distinctive vocal tone and cinematic production, Yndling has been praised by international media—including The Line of Best Fit, who wrote: “*Yndling is reinventing dream pop.*”

Her second album, *Time Time Time (I'm in the Palm of Your Hand)* (Nov 2025), signaled a breakthrough moment. The lead single “it’s almost like you’re here” and the title track gained major Spotify support on playlists like LOREM, Oyster, Shoegaze now and New Music Friday, helping the album approach three million streams within weeks.

On stage, Yndling’s profile has risen rapidly. After more than 25 shows across Europe and her first UK headline tour—featuring sold-out concerts in London and Manchester—she has become known for her immersive, emotionally charged live performances. In 2025 she appeared at SXSW, ESNS, and SPOT Festival, and in 2026 she continues her momentum with a European headline tour in March, including Berlin, Bern, Paris, and Barcelona, followed by a First Fifty selection for The Great Escape in May 2026.

With a growing international fanbase in the US and UK, Yndling enters 2026 as a live act on the rise—carrying her dream-pop world confidently onto bigger stages.
